Grey Wolf Parent / Guardian information Guide

Your Cub Scout has elected to attempt the Grey Wolf Award. This award is the highest in the Cub Scout section and thus not all Cub Scout will achieve the award. As it requires considerable effort over a long period on time and with the Collation of a log book covering their time and sections of the award scheme in the Cub Scout section relating to the Grey Wolf Award.

The award has stringent guidelines for the Cub Scout and Leaders to follow, that has been set at a national Scouting level and adopted by all State and Territories of Australia. As with all Scouting Awards "it is to the best of your ability" when completing any task.

A summary of the process once your Cub Scout has completed the Grey Wolf criteria:

The Cub Scout's logbook is to be completed by the time they turn 10.5 years old.
The Cub Scout Leader is to assess that the work is to the "best of the Cub Scout Ability".
The logbook, application form and a group cheque for \$7 is too forwarded to the District Cub Scout Leaders.

A one-month extension is available only on medical grounds and must be arranged with RC-CS prior to the Cub's 10.5 yrs closing date. Or If the closing date is due during a term break then the RC-CS is to be informed that the completed log will be forwarded by the Cub Leader to the nominated Address for processing.

The DCSL will assess that all the criteria have been completed, if a cub Scout has not completed the criteria, then they will have one month to complete and return the completed log to their Cub Leader who then has one week to forward the log to their DCSL.
The DCSL will then submit the log to the Regional Cub Council for approval.
On approved the RC-Cub Scouts will proceed with the final stages.
(Can take up to 6 weeks before official confirmation is received).

When the RC-CS receives the Grey Wolf Award kit from State, the District Cub Scout leader for your Cub Scout will have been forwarded the "Grey Wolf Badge" for presentation. This presentation will be in consultation with the Cub Leaders and Parent / guardian on a time and date.

The Region will arrange 2-4 Grey Wolf presentation days through out the year. This will depend on numbers of awardees. If a Cub Scout is unable to attend the presentation day then the RC-CS will try to present their certificate and woggle in their District at a time and place that suits the RC-CS or designate.

These arrangements are in accordance with National and State Cub Council Guidelines relating to the Grey Wolf Award.

Requirements for Getting Your Grey Wolf Award

1. Obtain your Gold Boomerang.

(Gold Boomerang challenges should be started after a cub Scout turn 9.5 yrs old)

2. In the past 12 months have participated in a minimum of 4 outdoor activities.

- One of which **must** be an overnight camp
- One should be an interpack activity

3. Using a map; plan and lead a bushwalk or Walk of at least 2 hours duration in consultation with your Leader.

With a leader and a group of Cub Scouts (at least 3 and no more than 6). Make sure everyone has the right equipment, clothing, food and personal first aid kit for your chosen bushwalk / Walk.

4. **In the past 12 months you must have attended two Pack Councils.**

(These can be at District level or with your own Pack).

- Include two different Pack Council minutes that you wrote into your logbook.

5. Have completed a minimum four “level 2” Achievement Badges that including 1 from each of the badge categories plus 1 special interest badges.

(These badges can be earned any time up to your turn 10.5 yrs old)

6. Develop and present a resource for your Six or Pack based on your understanding of the Jungle Book.

Some suggestions are below but you may be able to think up something quite different.

(No Cross words or find a word activities will be accepted)

- A game (active, board or card)
- Craft
- Skit/play, puppets or a booklet
- A shoe box diorama

7. Complete a Log Book, which is to include the following;

- A short report on each activity you have done
- A report on the Grey Wolf Camp or equivalent (if attended but not mandatory to attend)
- A copy of the bushwalk / walk that you did with descriptions; (How, where what you did).
- Copies of the 2 Pack councils minutes you attended.
- Report on the 4 outdoor activities you have attended.
- A report on what you did for the 5 badges you have earned.
- Description of the resource you made for your Six or Pack.

8. Your Grey Wolf logbook is to be completed by the time you turn 10.5 years old. The Cub Scout Leader is to assess that the work is to the “best of your Ability”. The logbook, application form and a group cheque for \$7 is to be presented to the District Cub Scout Leaders by one of your leaders. A one-month extension can be granted due on medical grounds but must be arranged by your leaders and the DCSL with RC-CS prior to the Cub’s 10.5 yrs closing date.

9. The DCSL will assess that all the criteria have been completed, if you have not completed the criteria then they will have one month to complete and return the completed log to your Cub Leader who has one week to hand the log to the DCSL. The DCSL will then submit the log to the Regional Cub Council for approval. On approval, the RC-Cub Scouts will proceed with the final stages of the process.

(can take up to 6 weeks before official confirmation is received)

Grey Wolf Camp

1. Where did you go for the camp?
2. Who was on the camp with you?
3. Write down what bases you did & briefly what you did on the bases.
4. Were you on your own or in a six? If so were they all from you own pack.
5. Anything else happen on the camp?
6. How did you feel when you had finished the camp?

Outdoor Activities.

The following questions may help you in writing this report. Please do not just answer the questions. It needs to be in a story about what you did.

- Where did you camp on your overnight camp?
- Who went with you?
- How did you get there?
- What did you do on this camp?
- Who did you visit for your interpack activity?
- What did you do on your interpack activity?

Bushwalk.

The following questions may help you in writing this report. Please do not just answer the questions. It needs to be in a story about what you did.

- Who help plan the walk?
- Where did you start?
- Where did you finish?
- Was there anything unusual in the bush?
- Did you take any bearings if so what were they?
- Who went with you?
- How did you go using a compass?
- When did you go? (moming or afternoon + date)
- Did you stop along the way? If so why did you stop?

Achievement & Special Interest Badges

A short story on what you did to gain the four (level 2) badges & the one special interest badges.

Resource

A story on the resource you made for your pack.

Some suggestions:

- A game (active, board or card)
- Craft
- Skit/play, puppets or a booklet
- A shoe box diorama
- Or a resource of your own choice
